# Rocket boys garner 4th place

OSHKOSH — The Neenah boys' cross country team garnered a fourth place finish in the Oshkosh North Invitational at Winnebago County Park Tuesday afternoon.

Appleton East took first place with 86 points, followed by Two Rivers 90, Manitowoc 106, Neenah 127, Appleton West 151, Oshkosh West 157, Green Bay East 161, Oshkosh North 176,

Fond du Lac 244, Green Bay West 297, Sheboygan South 300, Kaukauna 304, Menasha 307, Sheboygan North 331 and Springs 349.

Bob Burt of Appleton West was the individual winner in 15:46.

Ted Owen led the Rockets with a 12th place finish in 16:44. Bill Jarosh was 17th in 16:52, Eric Oakley 20th in 16:58, John Boudry 36th in 17:19, Tom Schaper 42nd in 17:29, Erik Scribner 47th in 17:36 and Tom Lamb 75th in 18:19.

"I'm pleased because we beat Appleton West, Oshkosh North and Oshkosh West all handily and they beat us handily at Shawano," Coach Tom Jensen said.

He said Appleton West's third runner was missing but Neenah would have finished ahead of the Terrors even if he had run.

"There are places where we can improve. If we can put five together, we will be all right," Jensen added.

Menasha's places were Ted Thomson 50th, Mike Madsen 53rd, Craig Noffke 64th, John Rohr 67th. Todd Mason 73rd, Peter Schwonek 74th and Tom Kopitzke 95th.

Neenah's No. 1 junior varsity team tied for second place with Two Rivers, scoring 72 points to Manitowoc's 41. The No. 2 team was sixth with 176.

Places on the No. 1 squad, composed of juniors and seniors, were Jim Lamb sixth, Rob Wilson 12th, Kevin Shaddock 13th, John Makowski 14th, Pat Shandonay 27th and John Kidd 46th.

Finishers on the No. 2 team, made up of freshmen and sophomores, were Alex Collins 10th, Andy Christian 28th, Scott Meulemans 31st, Chris Fiedler 44th, Jeff Enz 63rd, Jeff Wheeler 78th and Chris Klatka 82nd.

Neenah is at Wauwatosa East and Menasha at Wausau for Saturday invitational.

# NHS girls win at North

OSHKOSH — Neenah's unbeaten girls' cross country team was first and Menasha finished third in the Oshkosh North Invitational at Winnebago County Park Tuesday afternoon.

The Neenah girls, in winning their 17th invitational meet in a row and their third this season, totaled 21 points. Appleton East was a distant second with 118.

Menasha tallied 131, Oshkosh North 150, Green Bay West 162, Kaukauna Black 173, Two Rivers 190, Green Bay East 206, Neenah No. 2 250, Oshkosh West 329, Sheboygan North 337, Manitowoc 387, Sheboygan South 389, Two Rivers No. 2 420 and Kaukauna White 427.

Senior Kathy Schaller won her third straight race for the Rockets. Her winning time was 11:34.

Colette Goudreau was second in 11:43, Eileen Schaller fourth in 11:56, Kathy Monard sixth in 11:58, Joan Swanson eighth in 12:04, Kris Burr ninth in 12:05 and Sue Burr 14th in 12:34.

Becky Boegh led the Menasha finishers with a fifth place in 11:57.

Jill Jackson was 22nd, Sara Morawek 25th, Kelly Owen 36th, Terese Mulder 45th and Jodi VanderWielen 46th.

Third place went to Gail Montivedio of Green Bay West.

Places for Neenah's No. 2 team were Amy Rusch 28th, Lyn Moede 34th, Robyn Goudreau 44th, Jill Camber 42nd and Jan Schaper 82nd.

"I'm very pleased. We had seven girls in the top 15. That shows how well the whole group works together," Neenah Coach Ron Fedenko

said.

"All times were improved over last year's race. It was a great team effort," Fedenko added, noting that the No. 2 team also did very well in finishing ninth.

"Our girls did real well. We have a super group of runners," Menasha Coach Terry Langan stated.

"We're not going to win everything but we'll stick our noses in there and will be competitive," Langan added.

The Neenah girls will compete in the Wauwatosa East Invitational for the first time Saturday.

Other entries are Greendale, Homestead, Manitowoc, Racine Case, Waukesha South and host Tosa East. Menasha will travel to Wausau Saturday to compete in an invitational.

Langan said the course is hilly and probably is the toughest in the state.
