'Point' terminates Rocket win string

NEENAH — By a mere nine seconds, the various winning strings registered by the Neenah High School girls' cross country team were terminated in the Laser Invitational at Kettle-Moraine Saturday.

In a meet in which total times were used to decide the results instead of the usual individual places, Stevens Point, ranked No. 1 in the state, totaled 59 minutes, 31 seconds to 59.40 for the Rockets.

The loss ended the Rockets' string of meet victories at 28 (12 in 1981 and 1982 and the first four this fall) and their skein of invitational triumphs at 22, dating back to 1979.

Racine Case was third at 61:47, followed by Waukesha North and Waukesha South 62:26, Madison East 64:44, Fond du Lac 65:07 and Milwaukee Marshall 71:35.

The meet was composed of 64 schools, divided into four divisions. However, the Nos. 1 and 2 runners in the four divisions ran against each and the same for Nos. 3 and 4 and 5 and 6.

Susy Favor of Stevens Point was first in 11:11 with Sue Keeney, Middleton, second; Ginny Craine, Franklin, third; Kris Favor, Stevens Point, fourth, and Neenah's Eileen Schaller, fifth.

The loss was the first of the season for Schaller, who was clocked in 11:42.

Kathy Monard was sixth in 11:42 and Kris Burr eighth in 11:51. Other times were Sue Burr 12:09, Joan Swanson 12:15, Jill Camber 12:43 and Lyn Moede 13:27.

Coach Ron Fedenko said Monard was first in the race involving third and fourth runners and Sue Burr finished first among the fifth and sixth group.

Fedenko said he wasn't dis-

appointed, noting that all of the girls ran well. He pointed out that Camber had her best effort.

"We know we can stay with them (Stevens Point). We'll be competitive," he said of the possible meeting at the state meet.

Fedenko added that the pressure and experience that went into the meet was well worth the effort for the girls.

The Neenah boys finished eighth with 87 minutes, 37 seconds.

Racine Case won with 83:26, followed by Milwaukee South 84:10, Madison East 85:04, Waukesha South 86:05, Waukesha North 86:57, Fond du Lac 87:24, Milwaukee Marshall 87:35 and the Rockets.

Neenah times were Eric Oakley 16:30, Erik Scribner 71:11, Scott Meulemans 17:52, Tom Schaper 18:00, Jim Lamb 18:03, Rob Wilson 18:30, Bill Hammett 18:54 and Glen Smith 19:00.

Coach Tom Jensen said Oakley, Scribner and Meulemans ran well but that Schaper was hampered by stomach cramps.

The girls' junior varsity team was fifth in the meet won by Stevens Point.

Amy Garlock of Neenah was first in 12:53 and Kathy Gilmore second in 13:02. Other places were Kathy Burr 21st, Jan Schaper 47th and Karen Reiden 82nd.

The Neenah boys' jayvees garnered seventh place with 229 points. Marquette won with 32.

Neenah places were Brian LeGault 15th, Todd Napiwocki 36th, Alex Collins 57th, Jeff Enz 60th, Alex Scribner 61st, Darin Schoening 97th, Chris Brown 127th and Alex Christian 139th.

The Rockets will host Oshkosh West, Appleton West and Oshkosh North Tuesday afternoon.

The boys' jayvee race will begin at 4:30 at Memorial Park, followed by the boys' varsity at 5 p.m. and girls' run at 5:30.
