3 veteran NHS runners return

NEENAH — The Neenah High School boys' cross country team was slated to open its season today in a home dual against Menasha with three lettermen available.

Returnees, all seniors, are Tom Schaper, Eric Oakley and Erik Scribner.

Other seniors include Darin Schoening, Bill Hammett, Jim Lamb and Rob Wilson.

Lamb ran several varsity races last fall while Hammett and Wilson were on the jayvee squad.

Junior candidates are Jeff Enz, Todd Napiwocki, Glen R. Smith, Glen A. Smith and Ben Christian.

Other squad members include Jeff Wheeler and Scott Meulemans, sophomores, and Brian LeGault, Alex

Scribner and Russ Stern, freshmen.

Senior John Kidd and, possibly some other candidates, are expected to join the team when school begins later this week.

Kidd, Enz, Meulemans, Christian, Wheelr and Napiwocki were on the jayvee team a year ago.

"We have four seniors performing well. We're really looking for a fifth man. Hopefully one will emerge. A fifth man is so important," Coach Tom Jensen said.

Jensen said the leading runners have been Oakley, Scribner, Lamb and Schaper.

Oakley was the No. 2 runner most

of last season, although he finished first in a quadrangular. He was fifth in the conference meet and sixth in the sectional.

Schaper was 12th in both the conference and sectionals while Scribner was 16th in the FVA meet and 19th in the sectional.

Of the varsity newcomers, Meulemans and Glen R. Smith have been looking good, Jensen pointed out.

He noted that the Rockets do not have as much depth as in other years when as many as 30 candidates reported.

Lost by graduation were Ted Owen, No. 1 runner in most meets, Bill Jarosh, John Boudry, Tom Lamb and Kevin Shattuck.

The Rockets are defending Fox Valley Association champions. They finished second in the sectional.

They'll open their series of weekend invitational meets at Brookfield East Saturday.

Glen Severson again is assisting Jensen.

Champion harriers launch new season

NEENAH — Two down, can they make it three?

The first indication to the type of answer to the above question will be seen Tuesday afternoon when the Neenah High School girls' cross country team opens its schedule with a home dual against Menasha.

The Rockets, who have captured two straight WIAA Class A state championships, haven't lost in some 25 meets in the last two seasons, taking in duals, quadrangulars, conference, sectional and state tests.

With the opening meet, the Rockets begin, more or less, the fourth phase of their young cross country history.

The first year was one of unknowns and, in the second, Patti Fredrick, as a freshman, became one of the area's outstanding runners.

Colette Goudreau joined the team the next year, starting the third phase. She was joined by Kathy Schaller a year later and they were stalwarts on the 2-year stat echampions.

Both graduated last spring and the latest era will commence Tuesday afternoon.

Coach Ron Fedenko begins his second season as coach of the Rocket girls with five returning letterwinners.

They are Eileen Schaller, who was 11th in the state meet last year; Kris and Sue Burr, 36th and 42nd, respectively; Kathy Monard, who was 15th, and Joan Swanson, 25th.

Kathy Schaller placed second, the only race she didn't win all

year, and Goudreau finished 23rd. The latter was hampered by an injury late in the season and didn't run in the conference meet.

Eileen Schaller and Monard are juniors; the rest seniors.

Other squad members include senior Jill Camber, who was on the team last year, and Ingrid Landman, who wasn't; juniors Lyn Moede, alternate on the state meet team, and Joan Schaper; sophomores Karen Schweiss, Kathy Burr and Karen Rieder and freshman Kathy Gilmore and Amy Garlock.

A year ago, there were no freshmen on the team.

"The girls have worked hard all summer. They were very diligent about running and also worked on the weights," Fedenko said.

He added that the Burrs and Schallers have been running pretty even in time trials.

Fedenko noted that the lettermen, Moede and Camber probably will make up the varsity lineup for the first meet.

The Rockets, through the invitationals, probably will meet most of the strong teams in the state before the sectionals, Fedenko noted.
