# Rockets win 'Tosa meet

WAUWATOSA — Eileen Schaller and her Neenah High School girls' cross country running mates made it four straight invitationals Saturday by sweeping first place in the Wauwatosa East meet.

Schaller, unbeaten in four invitationals, led the Rockets to a low score of 22 points.

Oak Creek trailed the defending meet champions with 45 points, the closest an opponent has come this fall, and Racine Case was third with 94.

Manitowoc tallied 95, Waukesha South 100, Menomonee Falls North 160, Wauwatosa East 186, St. Mary Academy 225 and Greendale 248.

The Neenah boys team garnered 10th place in the meet won by Menomonee Falls North with 56.

Racine Case had 87, Greendale 146, Milwaukee South 155, Marquette 159,

Madison La Follette 160, Waukesha South 198, Manitowoc 203, Wauwatosa West and Neenah 213 (West was awarded ninth place because of better finish by its sixth runner), Wauwatosa East 268, St. Thomas More 279, Oak Creek 314 and St. John 418.

Schaller won the girls' race in 11:48, finishing two seconds ahead of teammate Kris Burr.

Joan Swanson was fifth in 12:06, Kathy Monard sixth in 12:08, Sue Burr eighth in 12:14, Jill Camber 23rd and Lyn Moede 27th.

"The girls ran together at the start. The top five ran up front. Eileen led the whole race and Kris was second. Eileen had a cold and was not as strong," Coach Ron Fedenko pointed out.

Jay Korda of Greendale won the boys' race in 16:05.

Neenah's Eric Oakley was 12th in 16:54, Tom Schaper 14th in 16:57, Erik Scribner 54th in 17:48, Jim Lamb 62nd in 17:59, Scott Meulemans 71st in 18:18, Glen Smith 96th in 19:28 and Bill Hammett 97th in 19:31.

Coach Tom Jensen said Oakley and Schaper ran well in a strong field.

The Neenah junior varsity girls' team was second with 67 points, 20 behind Oak Creek.

Amy Garlock was first in 13:19, Kathy Gilmore third in 13:33, Jan Schaper eighth in 14:26, Kathy Burr 15th in 14:56 and Karen Rieden 40th in 15:53.

Fedenko was especially pleased with his jayvee runners. He said Garlock passed the leader at the 1½ mile mark, that Gilmore was up front, too, that Burr did a good job although she was ill all week and that Schaper ran her best race and has shown a lot of improvement.

Neenah's junior varsity boys' team placed ninth on a 19th place by Rob Wilson (18:41), 64th by Alex Scribner (19:51), 70th by Todd Napiwocki, 79th by Mike Halverson and 81st by Darin Schoening. Jeff Enz was 85th and Chris Brown 124th.

The Rocket teams will compete in the Laser Invitational at Kettle-Morraine next Saturday.

Although he doesn't know the entire field, Fedenko said No. 1 ranked Stevens' Point (both boys and girls) may be there.
