Final invitational for Rockets

NEENAH-MENASHA — The Neenah High School boys' and girls' cross country teams will conclude their schedule of invitationals at Fort Atkinson Saturday.

The Neenah girls won their fifth straight invitational, their seventh meet of the fall and their 14th spanning the last two years when they placed first at Grafton last Saturday.

They totaled 24 points, one of their lowest totals in recent meets, to outdistance Waukesha Memorial, which finished second with 49.

Kathy Monard garnered her fourth first place and led the Rockets for the fifth straight meet when she bested Waukesha Memorial's Terese LeFevre by 20 seconds.

Eileen Schaller, who missed five meets because of a foot injury, finished third in 12:21. Amy Garlock was fourth and Jenny Owens fifth.

The Neenah boys were seventh with 188 points. Milwaukee Thomas More won with 62.

Scott Meulemans led the Rocket winners with a 31st-place finish. Alex Collins was 32nd and Alex Scribner 39th.

The Menasha teams wrapped up their schedule of invitationals at Racine Case Saturday.

The girls' team finished fifth with 131 points, trailing Waukesha North (34), Racine Case (66), Waukesha South (82) and Milwaukee Pius (120).

Mindy Crumm placed 11th, Kelly Owen 21st, Deena Andrews 29th and Missy Eisner 30th to lead the Blue-

jays.

The Menasha boys were ninth in the 11-team field with 471 points. Milwaukee South edged Waukesha South 222-23 for first place.

The scores were higher than usual because teams entered 10 runners, eight counting in the scoring.

The Bluejays' Tom Severson finished in eighth place. Don Harp was 31st and Jeff Vollmer 47th.

Neenah runners defend FVA title

MENASHA — The Neenah girls' cross country team goes after its sixth straight Fox Valley Association championship in the eighth annual meet on the Country Side Course at Kaukauna Thursday.

Appleton East will defend its championship in the 15th annual boys' run.

The varsity girls' race is scheduled at 5 p.m. and will be preceded by a jayvee-open girls' run at 3:30, boys' jayvees at 4 p.m. and varsity boys at 4:30.

The Neenah girls won the last five crowns by scores ranging from 15 points in 1981 to 31 in 1979. They tallied 19 last fall.

The Rockets have won six of the first seven titles, the exception being Menasha's 1978 victory.

They carry a string of 16 straight meet victories (seven from last fall and all nine this season) into the meet and have only lost twice in the last four seasons.

The Neenah girls, who have defeated all conference opponents in dual or quadrangular competition, are expected to be challenged by the Bluejays, Oshkosh North and the Appleton schools.

Eileen Schaller is the defending individual champion but is coming off a foot injury which forced her to miss four meets. She finished third in the Grafton Invitational, second in the quadrangular and sixth in the Fort Atkinson Invitational since coming back.

Kathy Monard, who lost two close races to Schaller at the start of the season, has been almost unbeatable since then.

Monard placed first in the Shawano, Wauwautosa East, Grafton and

Fort Atkinson invitationals and lost only to Stevens Point's Kris Favor, one of the top runners in the nation. She was third in last year's meet.

The Rockets have had the last five individual champions in Colette Goudreau (three years), Kathy Schaller and Eileen Schaller.

The Rockets closed their regular season by defeating Monroe by five points at Fort Atkinson Saturday, while the Bluejays have been idle since besting Appleton West, Oshkosh West and Kimberly in a quadrangular although missing three of their regular runners.

Appleton East and Neenah usually

have challenged each other for the boys' crown, but the Rockets haven't had a good season while the Patriots, Appleton West and Oshkosh North sport the most impressive records.

Tom Severson, who was first in both quadrangulars, is expected to be a strong contender for individual honors as the Bluejays attempt to improve on last year's sixth place finish.

The Rockets still lead in championships with seven undisputed crowns and a tie with East in 1971.

The Patriots have five solo titles and Kaukauna won once.

FVA's harrier meet Thursday

KAUKAUNA — The Neenah girls and Appleton East boys' teams will defend their championships in the 15th annual Fox Valley Association cross country meet at the Countryside Golf Club Thursday afternoon.

The Rockets will be bidding for their sixth straight girls' title and their seventh in the last eight years.

Appleton East, which seeks its second consecutive boys' crown, has won five championships and tied for another.

Neenah's Eileen Schaller is the defending champion in the girls' meet. Returnees also include Neenah's Kathy Monard, third last year, and Oshkosh North's Meghan McCarthy and Beth Weiland, who were fourth and fifth, respectively.

None of the top five boys' runners return.

The 4-race meet begins with an open-jayvee girls' race at 3:30 p.m. The boys' junior varsity run is slated at 4 p.m., the boys' varsity at 4:30 and girls' varsity at 5 p.m.

East and Neenah harriers win titles

KAUKAUNA — Appleton East's boys used balance, while Neenah's girls overwhelmed the competition to win team championships in the Fox Valley Association cross country meet Thursday at Countryside Golf Course.

While Oshkosh North's Doug Swanke was edging Appleton West's Paul Spicer and Menasha's Tom Severson for individual honors, the team title was being decided back in the pack.

East's Jeff DuBord and Steve Jones overcame Oshkosh North's Paul Herold and Dave Polishinski in the final 300 yards to finish ninth and 10th, while the Patriots' Scott Wing and Jamie Weise edged out North's Chris McConnell for 19th and 20th.

Those four swing finishes, coupled with a fourth place by Mike Miller, helped East beat North 62-71. Appleton West was third with 75.

"This was a great win, mainly because it was a surprise," said East Coach Joe Perez, whose team successfully defended its title. "Coming in, I was afraid our team, which is young, would be thinking that they might win, rather than they would go out and try to win.

"I was really pleased with Steve Jones' 10th place. He's just a sophomore. And DuBord came out late for the season. But he came through with a ninth. And, of course, Miller was

our leader, just as he has been all season."

Spicer led most of the 5,000-meter race until Swanke exploded past him in the last 800 meters.

"I wanted to stay back but keep in touch for the first part of the race and then try to get it at the end," said Swanke, who was clocked in 16:15. "The guys that I figured I had to beat to win it were right there. The conditions were ideal for me today. It was really nice weather to run in."

"I don't have a strong kick," said Spicer, a junior. "He (Swanke) just had too much for me at the end of the race."

"I wanted to take off on the back stretch, but Paul (Spicer) took off at the same time," Severson said. "He relaxed going up a hill and then took off going down and I couldn't catch him. And then at the end of the race I just couldn't kick enough to go on by him."

Paced by Kathy Monard's first place, defending champion Eileen Schaller's third, Amy Garlock's fifth and Jenny Owens' sixth, Neenah's girls won in a breeze with 33 points to 87 for runnerup Appleton East.

"Our runners finished about where I expected. I think that's a tribute to how hard they worked all season," said Neenah Coach Ron Fedenko, under whom the Rocket girls have won three straight league crowns.

"Kathy (Monard) has been run-

ning real well all season and was ready for today. Eileen (Schaller) is just coming off a foot injury and is just getting into shape."

Monard completed the 3,200-meter course in 11:04, 13 seconds better than Meghan McCarthy of Oshkosh North.

"I went out fast and just tried to hold the pace," said Monard. "I got a little tired at the end, but I felt pretty good all the way through. I'm very pleased with my performance."

Menasha's John Rodriguez won the JV boys' race and Becky Otto of Neenah the JV girls' event. The open division winners were Keith Krystek of Oshkosh West and Becky Mischler of Kaukauna.

Neenah captures sixth straight girls' title

KAUKAUNA — The Neenah girls' cross country team made sure that there were no surprises at Country-side Golf Course where the Fox Valley Association conference meet was held Thursday.

Four Rockets placed in the top 10 finishers of the 3,200 meter race, and the heavily favored Rockets easily captured their sixth consecutive team title, topping closest competitor Appleton East, 33-37. Neenah is currently ranked No. 1 in the state rankings.

Senior Kathy Monard led Neenah's parade, winning in 11:04, while Oshkosh North senior Meghan McCarthy finished second with a time of 11:17.

Oshkosh North Coach Chuck Reigel was pleased with McCarthy's performance.

"I'm happy for Meghan," he said. "She ran a good race."

For the Rockets, Eileen Schaller placed third, Amy Garlock fifth and Jenny Owens sixth.

Rounding out the top 10 were Appleton West's Tiffany Church (fourth) and Kris Helein (10th); and Appleton East's Karin Brice (seventh) and Tracie Balster (ninth).

After the race, Monard, who placed third at last year's FVA meet, embraced McCarthy and said, "Thanks for pushing me."

McCarthy, who was fourth last year, said that the two competitors have been good friends for almost four years now and that made it a bit easier to finish second.

"Of course you'd like to win," she said. "But it doesn't seem to hurt as bad losing to her (Monard)."

Oshkosh West's top finisher was Alicia Promer, who placed 21st with a time of 12:35.

Indian Coach Russ Hoxtell felt that he got the maximum effort out of his girls.

"We ran extremely well," Rocket Coach Ron Fedenko said. "The girls have been doing it all year. This was a real team effort."

"The reason the girls did so well is their hard work," Fedenko said. "The key to their success is the hours of training on their own. We're very fortunate to have the people willing to make that sacrifice."

Appleton West had 90 points, North 93, Kaukauna 97, Menasha 110, Oshkosh West 170 and Kimberly 221.
