Final invitational

NEENAH-MENASHA — The Neenah boys' and girls' cross-country teams will conclude their schedule of invitationals in the Waukesha Memorial meet Saturday.

The Waukesha meet replaces the former Fort Atkinson Invitational on the schedule.

The Neenah girls were second, scoring 52 points to Waukesha Memorial's 34 in the Grafton meet last weekend. The boys placed eighth.

Jenny Owens was first, giving the Rockets their initial individual victory in an invitational this fall.

Menasha's boys placed ninth in the Eagle Invitational at Racine. Tom Severson was the leading finisher with an 11th place.

Results of the girls' division at Racine were not available.

In a quadrangular early last week, the Neenah boys and girls both finished first. Menasha's boys were second and the girls finished third.

St. Mary's boys placed third in a triangular involving Xavier and Berlin, but Becky Otto was the individual winner in the girls' run.

The Neenah boys' junior varsity team bested Menasha and finished sixth in the Grafton Invitational.

Neenah eyes cross-country crown

NEENAH-MENASHA — The Neenah girls' cross-country team goes after its seventh straight Fox Valley Association championship in the annual meet on the Countryside Golf Course at Kaukauna Thursday afternoon.

The girls' race will begin at 5 p.m. and will be preceded by the boys' varsity race at 4:30 p.m., boys' jayvees at 4 o'clock and an open race for jayvee girls and anyone else not competing in the other three events at 3:30.

The Rocket girls are expected to receive their biggest challenge in recent conference meet history.

Appleton West and Kaukauna, both of whom have done well in invationals this fall, are expected to battle them for first place.

Leading contenders for individual honors include the Rockets' Jenny Owens and Amy Garlock; Beth Weiland, Oshkosh North; and Tiffany Church, Appleton West.

Church was fourth in last year's meet, Garlock fifth, Owens sixth and

Weiland eighth.

Owens has won her last four races, including the Grafton and Waukesha Memorial Invationals. Weiland also has run well this year.

The Menasha girls hope to improve on last year's sixth-place finish. Mindy Crum, their best finisher (12th place), leads them.

The boys' race has no outstanding team, although Appleton East probably rates an edge. It will be seeking its third straight championship.

Neenah, which has eight conference titles to its credit, is expected to move up considerably from last year's eight-place finish.

The Rockets won a dual, two triangulars and improved on last year's finishes in every triangular they have entered.

Menasha also wants to improve on last fall's fifth-place finish.

The Bluejays boast one of the leading returning runners in Tom Severson, third a year ago.

The Menasha teams were idle last weekend, while the Rockets closed out their schedule of invationals at Waukesha. The girls finished second to Preble 51-56. The boys were seventh.

St. Mary concluded its first season in several years in last week's Laconia Invitational.

Because of the lack of numbers, the Zephyrs will not enter the Fox Valley Christian Conference meet.

They've also been handicapped in that Becky Otto and Amy Plaisance, the two girls on the squad, have been injured. They didn't run at Laconia.

"For the first year, everyone improved. We hope to have more numbers out next year," Coach Mike Buss said.
