Neenah runners still unbeaten

NEENAH-MENASHA — Coach Ron Fedenko's Neenah High School girls' cross country team was still unbeaten after last weekend's meet but had its closest call of the young season.

The Rockets, with a dual and two invitational victories to their credit, and Wisconsin Rapids both scored 55 points in the Shawano Invitational but the Rockets received the trophy because their sixth-place runner won in the tie-breaker.

Jenny Owens was dealt her first loss in three starts when she finished 13 seconds behind Tammy Callahan of Wisconsin Rapids. Amy Garlock was fourth and Kayann Monard sixth.

Carolyn Heinen finished 16th but was running with the Neenah No. 2 team.

Menasha placed eighth with 249 points and was led by Jenni Siehr's 22nd place.

St. Mary Central's initial cross country championship was achieved when the Zephyr girls finished first in the Lourdes Invitational last week.

The Zephyrs tallied 44 points to 86 for runner-up Springs. They were led by Becky Otto, who placed third, Sue

Swiecichowski, fourth, and Amy Plaisance, ninth.

In another meet last week, the Menashans were fifth at Hortonville but Otto won the race. Swiecichowski was third.

The Neenah boys finished fifth at Shawano with 134 points. Rhinelander was first with 61. Alex Scribner's 15 place paced the Rockets.

Menasha was 12th with 345 points. Jeff Becker's 56th place was the lead-

ing finish.

The Bluejays were scheduled to compete in the D.C. Everest Invitational Tuesday and will run at New London, Saturday.

The Neenah teams will run at Wauwatosa East, and St. Mary will be in the St. Lawrence Invitational Saturday.

Harriers run at Shawano

NEENAH-MENASHA — The Neenah and Menasha cross country teams will compete in the Shawano Invitational Saturday after opening their seasons with a dual and "invites" last week.

The Rocket squads, in duals against Menasha at Jefferson Park, recorded the minimum score in one meet and just missed the minimum in the other.

The girls scored a 15-42 win, led by Jenny Owens, who posted a winning time of 11:48. Teammate Amy Garlock was second in 12:29. Jenny Arndt paced the Bluejays with a sixth place.

The Rocket boys chalked up a 16-43 verdict, paced by Alex Scribner's 17:23. He finished 30 seconds ahead of Jeff Reeve. Jeff Becker avoided a sweep by the Rockets when he placed fifth for the Bluejays.

The Neenah girls, as Owens won her second race of the week, garnered first place in the Rhinelander Invitational with 21 points, Phillips was second with 44.

Five Neenah runners finished in the top seven. Trailing Owens, who won in 12:04, were Garlock third, Kayann Monard fourth, Cathy Gilmore sixth and Lori Jesse seventh.

The Neenah boys were fourth with 132 points. Marshfield won with 55. Scribner was 16th for the best Neenah finish.

The Menasha boys took ninth in the Terror Invitational at Appleton with 211 points. Sheboygan North garnered first with 39. Becker's 24th placed led the Jays.

The Bluejay girls were fourth with 108. The host Terrors won their meet with 54. Leading Menasha was Jenni Siehr in 19th.

St. Mary Central opened its season in the Roncalli Invitational. The girls were fourth with 89 points. St. Joseph Academy won with 56. Becky Otto's fourth place paced the Zephyrs.

The boys finished fourth in the small school division with 119 points. Lourdes won with 40. Tony Wirth was 25th for the best St. Mary finish.

NM harriers winless

NEENAH-MENASHA — The Neenah boys' and girls' cross country teams will take Saturday off from their usual schedule of invitationals while Menasha's squads will journey to Racine for their final "invite" of the season.

The Rocket girls finished fourth in their division in the Kettle Moraine Invitational Saturday with a total time of 68 minutes, 26 seconds. Menomonee Falls won with 65:38.

Weekend invitationals

The meet is scored different than other invitationals because it is decided on times of the runners, rather than places.

Leading finishers for Neenah were Kayann Monard third and Cathy Gilmore 18th among the third and fourth runners; Renee Johnson 15th and Cheryl MacPhetridge 23rd among the fifth and sixth runners, and Lori Jesse seventh and Kari Vedder 10th among the seventh and eighth runners.

Jenny Owens didn't compete because of a sore leg, while Amy Garlock, who has been ill, finished back in the pack among the one and two runners.

Neenah's boys' team placed sixth among the nine entries in its division with 91:57. Fond du Lac led with 86:20.

No official places were available but Jeff Reeve was Neenah's leading finisher in 17:46.

The Menasha girls were seventh and the boys finished 10th in the Manitowoc Invitational last weekend.

The girls totaled 174 points and were led by Jenni Siehr's 17th place. Jenny Arndt was 26th and Kerry Decker 31st. Green Bay Preble was first with 40 points.

The Menasha boys accumulated 286 points. Manitowoc was first with 56.
