Spartan boys favored in 19th FVA harrier meet

NEENAH — Oshkosh North looms as the boys' division favorite, while the girls' crown is up for grabs in the 19th annual Fox Valley Association cross country meet on the Countryside course at Kaukauna Thursday afternoon.

The 4-race meet will open with the girls' open and junior varsity run at 3:30 p.m. The jayvee boys will run at 4 p.m., varsity boys at 4:30 and varsity girls at 5 o'clock.

The Spartans, looking for their first championship, have been the most impressive of the boys' squads. They handily won both quadrangulars involving conference entries and are led by Jason Ryf and Joe Knox, who finished sixth and 10th, respectively, last year.

Because the North squad isn't deep, Neenah could challenge if the former wouldn't be at full strength.

The Rockets have won nine of the first 18 championships, the last time in 1982. Appleton East has taken the last five. Neenah was third last fall.

Mike James of Kaukauna is the defending individual champion. Returnees also include Appleton East's Brian Sass, third last year; Neenah's Aaron Pues, who was seventh, and Menasha's Todd Arndt, eighth.

James could be the second runner to win two straight titles. The first was Appleton West's Brett Burt in 1982 and 1983.

The girls' race could develop into a battle between Appleton East, Neenah and Appleton West. The Rockets, however, have several injuries and haven't been at full strength in recent meets.

Kay Monard, their No. 1 runner, has missed the last three meets and Jackie Heinen, who has been finishing second or third, sat out the last

two.

The Rockets were first and the Terrors second in their initial quadrangular meet but the positions were reversed last week. Monard and Heinen ran in the first meeting, but not in the second.

The Patriots won both of their 4-team meets but the Terrors and Rockets weren't among the entries.

Bubolz will attempt to become the second runner to win three straight individual championships.

Neenah's Colette Goudreau finished first from 1979-81 but didn't compete in her senior year because of an injury.

Monard was fifth last year, third as a sophomore and eighth as a freshman. Other returnees include East's Britt Garton, seventh last fall and fifth two years ago; Kaukauna's Karla Schuessler, eighth last year, and Linnea Dahl, Oshkosh North, who didn't compete in 1987 but took fourth and seventh the two preceding autumns.

Bubolz, James run away with titles

KAUKAUNA

— It was the same old story as far as the individual titles were concerned at the Fox Valley Association Cross Country Meet at Countryside Golf Course Thursday afternoon.

Appleton West's Kristen Bubolz won her third consecutive girls' crown, while Kaukauna's Mike James captured the boys' championship for the second straight year.

Appleton East repeated as the North team champion, but Oshkosh new face in the winners' circle by snapping East's 5-year stanglehold on the boys' team competition.

Bubolz started fast and breezed to a 26-second win over runner-up Britt Garton of Appleton East to repeat the winning performances she had turned in as a sophomore and junior. Neenah's Colette Goudreau — who won in her freshman, sophomore and junior seasons — was the only other runner ever to capture three consecutive girls' championships.

"This was something that I was really shooting for," said Bubolz. "I'm just starting to come back after laying off all summer because of the stress fractures from last spring. I just wanted to run my own race, which I did, despite the wind."

James, on the other hand, had anything but an easy time while becoming the only other runner besides Appleton West's Brett Burt to win two

straight FVA titles. James trailed East's Brian Sass through most of the 5,000-meter course before kicking past the Patriot runner in the final 800 yards to win by seven seconds.

"I wanted to keep an eye on (Oshkosh North's Jason) Ryf at the start, but I looked around and I couldn't find him," said James. "Sass went out very fast, and he can really be strong when he wants to. And, he obviously wanted to today. I was worried at about three miles when they gave us our times and he was five seconds ahead of me. But he seemed to die on the last curve and I went by him."

Said Sass, "I felt Mike was the favorite because he really gets up for the big meets, and it was his home course. I tried to take the kick out of him at the start, and then hoped that he couldn't kick back."

Ryf, who according to most observers was the pre-meet favorite, got lost in the pack early and finished a disappointing eighth.

"I couldn't hear the start very well," said Ryf. "I turned to talk to someone just as the gun went off. After the start, I just couldn't get back up there."

Ryf's performance was more than balanced off, however, by teammate Chris Larson, who finished fourth. The Spartans also placed 11th, 12th and 14th en route to a 15-point edge over Appleton East for the team crown.

"North had never won a cross country championship, and as far as I know no Oshkosh school had ever won either," said North Coach Chuck Reigel. "Jason had a bad race today, but Chris really came through for us."

Despite having his string of FVA boys' championships snapped, East Coach Joe Perez was not disappointed, and he was positively eu-

phoric over the girls' triumph. Paced by Garton, Heather Downs in fourth, Alison McKee fifth and Kris Nummendor eighth, the Patriots finished easily ahead of Kaukauna and Appleton West.

"The boys gave it a good shot today," said Perez. "We weren't supposed to be there. I have no complaints about what they did. Our girls are a real good team. They've been ranked anywhere from second to fifth in the state all year, and they're all young."

Appleton East, which ran away with the girls' Fox Valley Association cross country title, did likewise in all-conference balloting.

Five Patriots were named to the 13-member first team selected by conference coaches. They include senior Kris Nammerdor, junior Britt Garton and sophomores Heather Downs, Alison McKee and Sarah Trigg.

In the balloting for the boys' team, champion Oshkosh North had three representatives on the all-senior, 11-runner first team; Chris Larson, Jason Ryf and Joe Knox.

Others named to the girls' first team were medalist Kristen Bubolz and Robin Dvorak of Appleton West, Kala Brogan and Karla Schuessler of Kaukauna, Neenah's Kay Monard, Oshkosh North's Lynn Dahl and Oshkosh West's Amy Leiby and Chris Gruendemann. Bubolz, Brogan, Monard, and Dahl are seniors; Dvorak, Schuessler, and Leiby juniors; and Gruendemann, the only sophomore.

Other boys accorded first-team honors were Appleton East's Brian Sass and Todd Lathrop, Appleton

West's Eric Stadler, Kaukauna's Mike James, Menasha's Todd Arndt, Neenah's John Paske and Aaron Pues, and Oshkosh West's Mike Burnman.

Monard made the first team for the fourth straight time. Garton, Bubolz, and Dahl repeated for the third time, while Schuessler made it for the second season in a row. Brogan, Trigg, and Downs were honorable mention last year.

Knox was the only 3-year first-team boys' pick. James, the individual champion, Sass, Arndt, and Pues also made the team last year.

Sheboygan North, fourth-ranked in the last week's state girls' poll, and FVA boys' winner Oshkosh North are
