Neenah boys win cross country sectional

Neenah won the boys' cross country title at the WIAA Division 1 Fond du Lac Sectional at the Rolling Meadows Golf Course Saturday. The Rockets took three of the top five individual places and edged Fond du Lac 48-53.

Neenah and Fond du Lac advance to the WIAA State Championships at the Ridges Golf Course in Wisconsin Rapids on Saturday.

No Oshkosh runners advanced as Oshkosh West finished 10th with 278 points and Oshkosh North was 14th with 417 points. Menasha was 15th with 440.

Rusty Burns finished 13th on the 5,000-meter course at Rolling Meadows Golf Course in 17 minutes 20 seconds. Mayer was 18th in 17:27.

Shawn Henslin was North's top runner with a 70th place time of 18:52.

Pat Gorman of Beaver Dam beat Neenah's Jon Carpenter for the top spot with a 15:54. Carpenter finished 14 seconds back. Neenah took the fourth and fifth

spots as Jason Jacobs ran a 16:49 and Tom Syverud ran a 16:55.

Neenah has now beaten Fond du Lac three straight times this season, including the conference meet.

"Ever since the Fond du Lac Relays (Sept. 29) we've really hit our stride," Neenah coach Tom Jensen said. "It's not easy to run two good races in a row. I suspected we might have a letdown, but it didn't happen."

No area runners advanced to the girls' state meet. Neenah led area teams with a seventh place score of 157. North was ninth with 251, West was 11th with 280 and Menasha was 16th with 382.

West's Chris Gruendemann covered the 3,200-meter course in 13:27 to lead her squad with a 32nd place. Jenny Disch led North with 39th place time of 13:42.

Appleton East beat Sheboygan North 99-109 for the team title.
