Cross country teams to make run at titles

This time of year, Countryside Golf Course becomes a home away from home for all Fox Valley Association cross country teams.

For the 11th straight year, the Kaukauna course will be the site of the boys' and girls' conference meet Thursday. And no one seems to mind a bit.

"Previously in Kaukauna it was held at Oakwood Hills, then when that went under it was at High Cliff for awhile and after that at Plamann Park in Appleton," said Kaukauna coach Gerald Brien. "When it was Kaukauna's turn again, we had it at Countryside. Then the next year, Kimberly asked us if we'd do it and after that we've assumed the responsibility for hosting it."

Defending champion Neenah and Fond du Lac are expected to battle for the team title in the boys' run, which begins at 4:30 p.m. In the girls' race at 5, the title is up for grabs among Neenah, Fond du Lac, Appleton West and Oshkosh West, with defending champion Appleton East a darkhorse.

The Rocket boys are led by Tom Syverud, the only re-

turning All-FVA member back from last year, and Erik Nelsen, who was honorable mention. Other contenders are Appleton East's Eric Olson, Kimberly's Mike Lamers and Kaukauna's Wade Thorson. All were all-conference in 1990.

Additional top individuals are Appleton West's Jason Hohnberger and Greg Abler, Fond du Lac's Adam McCullough, Brian Weit and Luke Reitz, Kimberly's Brian Kelihier, Kaukauna's Chad Huss, Oshkosh North's Jamie Juedes and Oshkosh West's Bill Parmentier.

NHS runners pegged FVA meet favorites

Neenah High School boys' and girls' cross country teams last won the Fox Valley Association championships simultaneously in 1982.

Both have won titles in different years since then, but, on the basis of records this fall, they could end the nine-year gap Thursday afternoon when the circuit holds its annual run on Kaukauna's Countryside Course.

The Rockets, defending champions in the boys' meet, should get their strongest competition from Fond du Lac.

The Cardinals were the only FVA team to defeat them in quadrangular competition this fall, but the margin was only a single point.

The Neenah girls have brushed

aside all conference competition and, like the boys, have done well in invitational meets throughout the state.

Neenah has the leading 1990 boys' finisher in Tom Syverud, who finished fifth. The only other returnee from last year's top 10 is Fond du Lac's Adam McCullough, the 10th placer.

The Rocket girls attempt to break a monopoly constructed by Appleton East, which has won the last four championships. Neenah's last crown was garnered five years ago.

The Rockets also have the top 1990 finisher on board in Karen Schaper, who entered the chute fifth. Teammate Julie Olson was seventh.

Rockets rule FVA cross country

Berlin boys, Omro girls win titles

The Fox Valley Association cross country meet got a double dose of the Neenah Rockets.

The Rockets edged Fond du Lac in both races to capture both the boys' and girls' titles Thursday at Kaukauna.

The Neenah boys' team finished with 37 points, Fond du Lac had 44, Oshkosh North finished seventh with 182 and Oshkosh West was eighth at 183.

Neenah's girls won the meet without a senior by tallying 45 points. Fond du lac had 54, Oshkosh West was fourth with 106 and Oshkosh North finished

fifth with 114.

Fond du Lac's Adam McCullough won the boys' race in 16 minutes, 42 seconds with teammate Brian Veit finishing second, but the Rockets' runners finished 3-4-5 to ensure their second straight FVA title.

"Anytime you win a conference championship, its the highlight of the season," Neenah coach Tom Jensen said.

Jaime Juedes finished 12th to pace the Spartans while Joe Werner was 25th to lead Oshkosh West.

The Neenah girls placed two sophomores and a freshman in the top 10 to ensure their top spot in the FVA. Karen Schaper was fourth, Julie Olson finished sixth and freshman Missy Klabunde was 10th.

Kim Griesbach of Kimberly

won the meet in 12:15 while Fond du Lac's Anne Koenigs was second.

Mahnichone Luangpraseuth paced Oshkosh North coming in fifth while Angie Gruendemann led Oshkosh West finishing ninth.

Rocket runners record a sweep

Kimberly's Griesbach wins girls' individual crown

KAUKAUNA — On a day when wind transformed the Countryside Golf Course into a beast of a cross country course, Adam McCullough and Kim Griesbach became its masters and ran away with titles at the Fox Valley Association meet Thursday afternoon.

McCullough, a 5-7, 114-pound sophomore from Fond du Lac and Kimberly's Griesbach, a 5-0, 85-pound freshman, attacked the course and took advantage of their strength on the hills to distance themselves from the rest of the field.

Neenah, meanwhile, used its considerable depth to win both the boys' and girls' competitions, edging Fond du Lac in both.

In the boys' race, McCullough and teammate Brian Veit finished one-two, but Neenah's Tom Syverud, Rhett Weyenberg and Tyler Schultz took the next three spots. All told, Neenah's five runners all finished among the top 14 for 37 points and a seven-point victory as it successfully defended its title.

"We had to beat Fond du Lac at four and five because we knew they'd be tough at the top," said Neenah coach Tom Jensen. "We knew we were better than they were at No. 3. Tyler Schultz has come on like gangbusters the last couple of weeks.

"At numbers three through five, that is where you've got the big pack," Jensen added. "You've got other teams helping you win and that's what happened today."

McCullough, who finished 10th in the FVA last year,

found winning the individual title a bit easier than expected.

"I wanted to go out in the lead and hold it. I don't like drafting that much. I like to be in the front," he said.

McCullough led the race from start to finish and finished in 16 minutes, 42 seconds.

But Fond du Lac Paul Butzen and the Cardinals watched the team title slip away when Neenah's Erik Nelson finished 11th and Tuffy Knoch surged to 14th.

"Neenah ran tougher than us today and that's what conference championships are all about — the team that runs tough on conference day," Butzen said.

Neenah's girls' team scored 45 points and placed three runners in the top 10, as each used strong kicks to move up over the final 200 yards.

"This group finished so strong and that was the key," said Neenah coach Ron Fedenko. "Today, every one of our runners competed as hard as she could. It was a total team effort."

The Cardinals scored 54 points for second, followed by Appleton West with 88.

Neenah did have a few anxious moments prior to the race.

"Karen Schaper had a really sore back. We weren't sure five minutes before the race if she was going to run," said Fedenko. "You've got to give her more credit than you can imagine. She had a sore, sore back. That was the key, obviously. Without her we would've been in a lot of trouble."

Schaper finished third in 12:34, overtaking Oshkosh North's Mahnichone Luangpraseuth at the tape. Katie Baumgart of Kaukauna was second in 12:31.

For Griesbach, only one of two varsity girls competing for Kimber-

ly, the victory helped avenge a loss to Fond du Lac's Anne Koenigs in the Papermakers' second meet of the season.

Griesbach hung back in third place until the mile-mark, when she made her move. She held the lead the remainder of the race, but admitted she kept a nervous eye on the Fond du Lac runner.

With 400 yards to go, Griesbach glanced over her shoulder to check on Koenigs, who, to the 14-year-old Kimberly runner's surprise, was well behind and fading. Griesbach never looked back again and cruised to the 16-second victory in 12:15.
