Highlights: Neenah boys' cross country team remains unbeaten

Neenah's boys' cross country team protected its perfect record by placing first in Saturday's strong Marquette Invitational at Milwaukee.

The Rockets, who previously won the Rhinelander and Shawano Invationals, tallied 70 points, 15 less than Racine Case.

Tyler Schulz was fourth, Bret Weyenberg seventh, Rhett Weyenberg 10th and Ryan Freund 16th.

The Neenah girls lost for the first time when they finished second to Waukesha North in the same meet.

Waukesha collected 29 points to 67 for the Rockets.

Karen Schaper placed seventh, Julie Olson 10th, Missy Klabunde 11th and Christy McCutcheon 13th.

The Menasha boys were fifth and the girls finished seventh in the New London Invitational. They totaled 128 and 178 points, respectively.

Matt Toeppler's fourth-place finish paced the boys, while the girls were led by Kim Hofkens' 10th and Patty Tietz's 14th places.

St. Mary Central's boys scored 136 points to finish fifth in the St. Lawrence Seminary Invitational at Mount Calvary.

Phil Dachelet was sixth, Ryan Pociask eighth and Tony Popp 12th for the Zephyrs.

Liz Rather was St. Mary's only girl runner. She finished 23rd.

► The Neenah girls won their fourth invitational in five starts with a time of 1:03.07 in the Fond du Lac Relays. Waukesha Memorial was second in 1:04.10.

Neenah's places included July Olson seventh and Missy Klabunde 15th in Race 1-2; Kristy McCutcheon first and Meghan Patterson second in Race 3-4; Karen Schaper first and Krista Erickson third in Race 5-6; and Sara Codner third and Christy Coder fourth in Race 7-8.

► Neenah's boys' cross country kept its perfect mark intact by outscoring Fond du Lac 24 to 45 in a quadrangular that also involved Oshkosh North and Menasha.

Tyler Schulz was second, Rhett Weyenberg third, Bret Weyenberg

fourth, Ryan Freund seventh, Tuffy Knoch eighth, Ben Hamblin ninth and Jay Frater 10th.

Matt Toeppler and Ben Campbell finished 15th and 16th, respectively, for the Bluejays.

Neenah's girls' runners also remained unbeaten against conference competition by recording a perfect score of 15 points in the same four-team meet.

Julie Olson, Missy Klabunde, Christy McCutcheon, Meghan Patterson and Karen Schaper finished first through fifth, respectively.

Menasha's Kim Hofkens was sixth and Neenah's Krista Erickson and Christi Codner were seventh and 10th, respectively. The Bluejays' Patti Tietz was 13th.

► Neenah's 96-90 swimming victory was decided by the final event when the 400 freestyle relay team of Missy Hood, Mandie Moderson, Kallie Moderson and Debbie Nussbaum finished first.

Nussbaum won the 50 freestyle and 100 backstroke and also swam on the winning medley relay four-some.

► Neenah remained unbeaten in soccer conference play with a 5-1 triumph over Oshkosh North.

Menasha dropped a 4-3 decision to Oshkosh West, falling to 4-2 in the league.

Neenah cross country teams look impressive in early meets

NEENAH — Stocked with good contingents of veteran runners, the Neenah High School girls' and boys' cross country teams are expected to make strong bids to retain their Fox Valley Association championships.

Both teams showed up well in their opening meets, winning five-team conference meets at Kimberly as well as Saturday's Hodag Invitational at Rhinelander.

Coach Ron Fedenko didn't lose any graduates from his 1991 girls' squad.

Juniors Karen Schaper and Julie Olson, chosen co-most valuable runners, are among the returnees.

Other letterwinners are senior Krista Lawell; juniors Julee Beckstrom and Christy Codner and sophomores Missy Klabunde, Krista Erickson, Lisa Heroux and Meghan Patterson.

The squad also includes junior My-

see Moua, sophomore Sarah Janda and freshmen Sara Codner, Christy McCutcheon, Holly Goudreau and Mandy Gunderson.

"I don't know if we have a strong No. 1 runner. We'll probably run in a group again," said Fedenko.

Neenah's best finishes in the conference meet last year were fourth and sixth by Schaper and Olson, respectively. However, the top five all finished within the first 15.

Olson was first and Schaper fifth in last week's FVA meet, while Olson's seventh and an eighth by McCutcheon led the Neenah runners at Rhinelander.

"Fond du Lac should be tough, and there are a lot of good individual runners in the conference," Fedenko said.

Tom Jensen, who has been coaching the boys' team since 1968, expects a good season from his runners if they can stay free of injuries.

"We lost Tom Syverud, Erik Nelsen and Eric Drumm, but everybody is a step ahead of last year," Jensen

said.

Three of their five leading conference finishers return in Rhett Weyenberg (fourth), Tyler Schulz (fifth) and Tuffy Knoch (14th).

Knoch and Schulz are seniors, and Weyenberg is a junior.

Other letterwinners are seniors Adam Miller and Ben Hamblin and juniors Rhett Weyenberg and Jay Frater.

Rounding out the squad are Tom Beck, senior; Justin Bricco and Ryan Mulroy, juniors; and Richard Rasmussen, Jason Michalkiewicz, Ben Miller, Chad Gorectke, Ryan Freund, Mike Brown and Brian Wankel, sophomores.

Schulz was first, Bret Weyenberg second and Rhett Weyenberg third in the five-team meet.

Schulz finished third, Bret Weyenberg fourth and Rhett Weyenberg eighth at Rhinelander.

Both Neenah teams are defending champions at Saturday's Shawano Invitational.
