Area runners abundant at state meet

While the coaches are confident, they know it won't be easy to bring home a championship.

"I feel we have a definite shot at the title," said Fedenko, coach of the Neenah girls' team. "We should be right there though anything can happen."

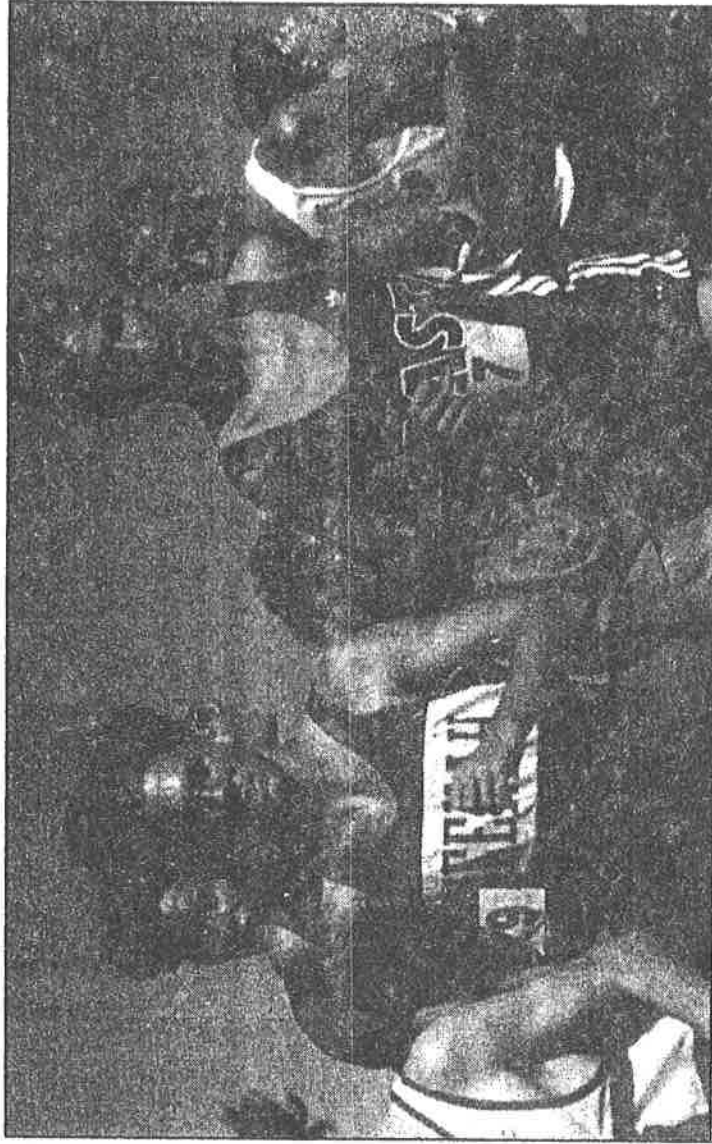
Christy McCutcheon, Meghan Patterson and Julie Olson have led the Neenah girls with Sara Codner and Christy Codner normally fill-

ing out the top five. Two years ago Neenah finished 15th at state while last year the Rockets were second.

"The girls have been working so hard," Fedenko said. "The 29 points we had at the sectional is a very low total. But we're going to need everyone on the team at their best. A key is mental toughness. Everyone normally tries to go out real fast at state and you can't do that. But you also can't stay back. It's a touchy situation."

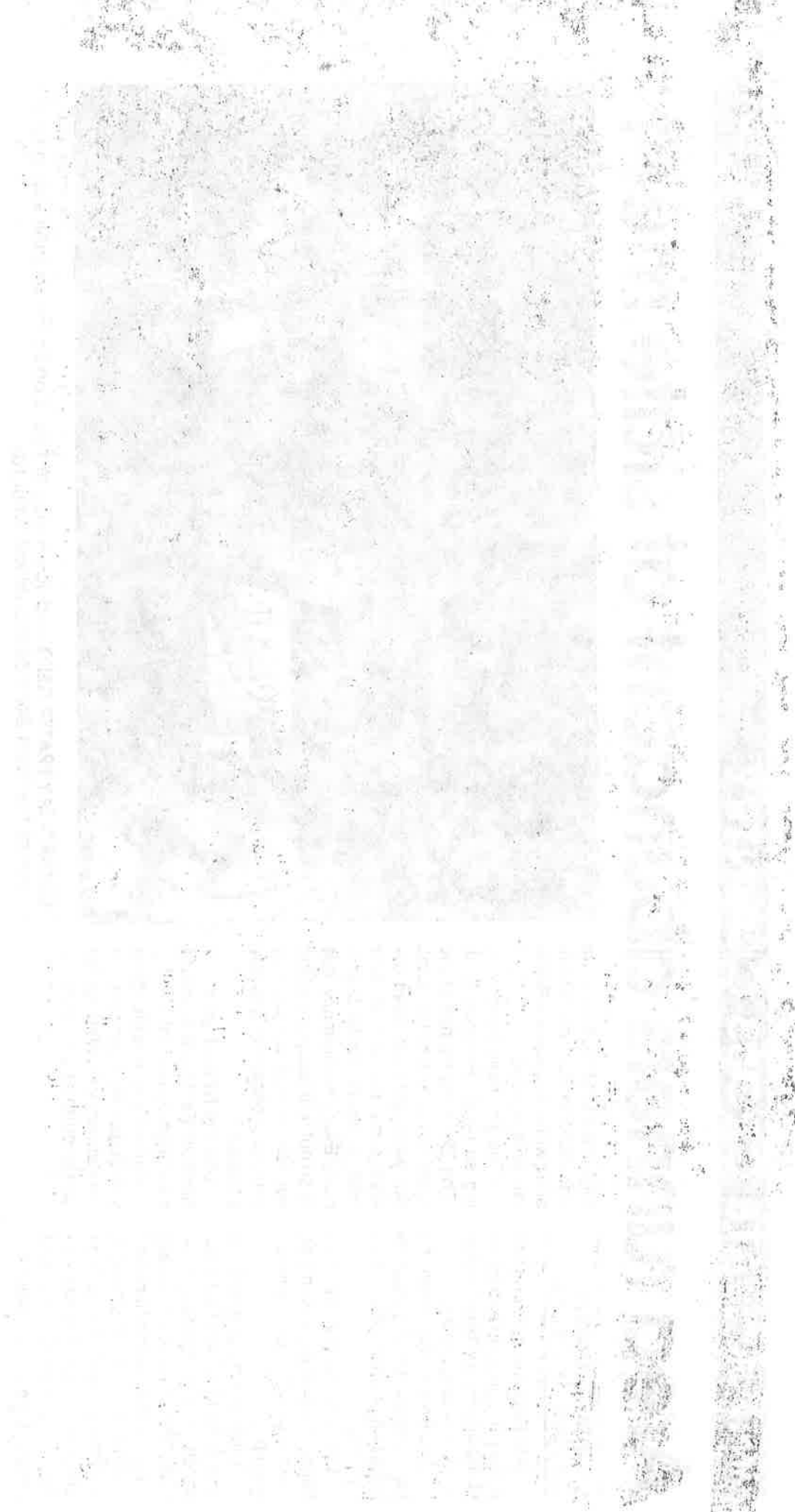
Like the Neenah girls, the Appleton East boys' team has also been consistent.

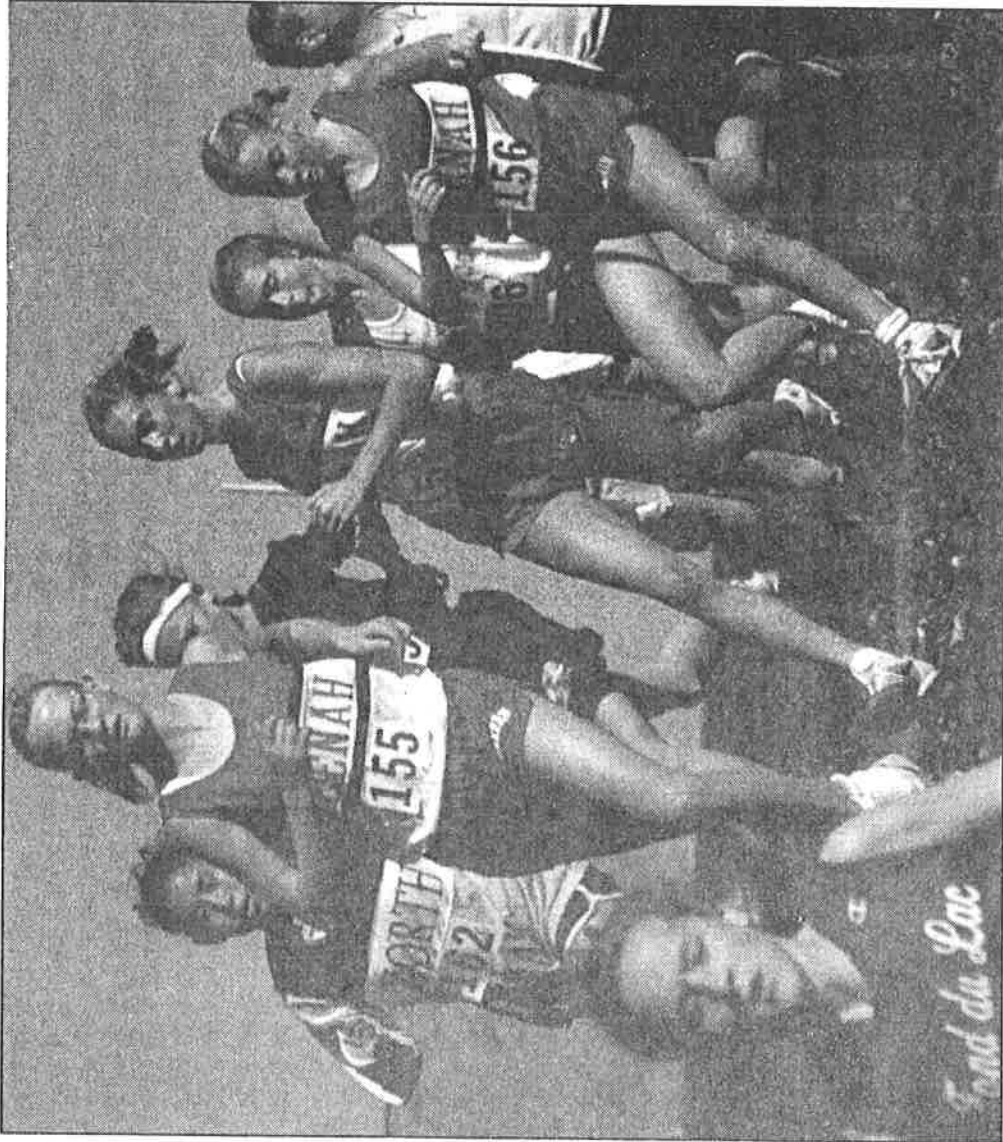
Aaron Sass, Abe Mendoza and Dugan Webster have led the Patriots, with Webster finishing fourth at sectional.

Although the Rockets team didn't make state — missing out by one place at sectional — Jensen is proud to have two runners going.

"Of course it would have been better to have the team go, but it's nice to have two individual qualifiers," Jensen said. "It's not that common to have two individuals going from non-qualifying teams."

While the Neenah girls and the East boys aim for team titles, three area individuals will attempt to end their seasons on a high note.

Both seniors, the Weyenbergs have spent plenty of time running together.

"They have a very close relationship," Neenah boys' coach Tom Jensen said. "They've been very supportive of each other."

Rhett Weyenberg, second at sectional, has led Neenah most of the year and Jensen expects him to do well at the state meet.

"Based on the people he has run against, Rhett should be near the top 10," Jensen said. "There are five or six runners in the state that are probably ahead of him."

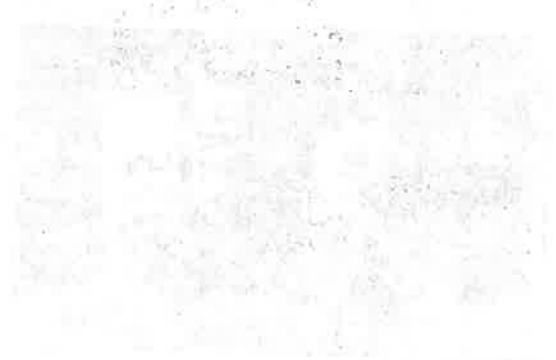

Neenah girls seek state harrier title

■ **The Neenah runners finished second in the 1992 WIAA cross country meet**

Runner-up in 1992, the Neenah High School girls cross country team hopes to reach the summit when it competes in the WIAA cross country meet at Wisconsin Rapids Saturday.

The girls will be accompanied by Rhett Weyenberg and Bret Weyenberg of the boys squad, who placed second and sixth, respectively, in the weekend sectional.

The Neenah girls, seeking their fourth straight crown, won the sectional with 29 points, an even 100 less than Fond du Lac.

The boys team missed qualifying for the state by one position with their third-place.

The girls' 29 points was the second-lowest among sectional champions.

Waukesha West took its sectional crown with 27, while other winning totals ranged from 40 to 57.

Sophomore Christy McCutcheon was Neenah's best individual finisher with her second place in 15:40.

Other members of the Neenah squad and their sectional finishes are Meghan Patterson, third; Julie Olson, sixth; Sara Codner, eighth; Christi Codner, 10th; Krista Erickson, 30th; and Heather Michalkie-

wicz, 40th.

"It should be wide open, but I think we have a good shot at winning. We've run against most of the top teams except La Crosse Central and Mukwonago," Rocket coach Ron Fedenko said.

Fedenko added the winning team could score 40-50 points.

"We won with 46 points in 1982 and with 51 in 1983," Fedenko noted.

La Crosse Central won the 1985 title with 51 points, but since then every Division 1 champion has scored at least 74.

The Rockets, who won state championships from 1981-83, were second last fall with 119 points. Champion Waukesha North totaled 80.

McCutcheon finished 20th, Patterson 23rd, Olson 30th, Sara Codner 65th, and Erickson 69th.

Returnees among last year's top finishers include champion Avrie Walters of La Crosse Logan; runner-up Angie Ziarek of Muskego; third-place Janet Westphal of Marinette; sixth-place Aimee Daug of Watertown; and seventh-place Jeni Westphal of Marinette.

Janet Westphal's 14:54 was the fastest sectional winning time.

BOYS: The Rockets qualified their entire team at last year's sectionals and finished at the state meet behind Middleton and Hartland Arrowhead. Bret Weyenberg was 29th at state, while Rhett Weyenberg, hampered by injuries, placed 127th.

In this year's sectional, Rhett's time of 16:29 was three seconds slower than winner Scott Hammer of West Bend West, who was 27th in last year's state meet.

Bret nailed down the sixth-place qualifying spot with his 16:39.

Among the state returnees are Micah Wabaunsee of La Crosse Central, seventh a year ago; Green Bay Preble's Dave Loritz, eighth, and Chad Reed of Brookfield East, 12th.

The state runs will be held at the Ridges Golf Course at Wisconsin Rapids.

The Division 1 girls race will start at 11:05 a.m. Saturday, and

WISCONSIN RAPIDS — After finishing second in 1992, the Neenah Rockets were confident they could beat all of last year's rivals at the WIAA Division 1 state cross country meet at The Ridges Golf Course.

This year, however, a new one got them.

Waukesha West, a high school which just opened this fall, bunched three runners in the top 16 slots to claim the title with 80 points. Neenah placed second with 122.

"We're very happy with second place," Rockets coach Ron Fedenko said afterward. "I saw a close race coming with Waukesha, Marinette and Janesville Craig all real tough."

Waukesha West also had the fortunate luck to get several runners from the 1992 champion, Waukesha North, when the school opened its doors this fall.

The Rockets packed their top five runners between 33rd and 46th place but the group wasn't far enough up to catch the Wolverines.

"I tried to stay with the front group," said Christy McCutcheon, who placed 33rd for lead Neenah. "But eventually, they just got away from me."

"We were exactly where we

wanted to be after the first mile," Fedenko said. "We knew we'd be packed in somewhere. It was good enough to get us second at state."

Kristina Betzold of Eau Claire North won the 4,000-meter race in 14:47.

Among other area individuals, Kelly Koplien of New London placed 22nd and Appleton West's Sarah McGlone was 77th.

WEYAUWEGA-FREMONT SIXTH: The Indians managed to edge season-long rival Wittenberg-Birnamwood in Division 2 on Rhonda Yach's 71st place finish.

W-F and the Chargers had tied with 166 points after each team's top five finishers. Yach was seven places ahead of W-B's Katie Funmaker, the Chargers' sixth runner.

"I'm just real happy for the team and the fact that we got to state," said W-F senior Jamie Loehrke, who led the Indians with a 25th place. "I had hoped to finish in the top 20 and I just missed that."
