viduals qualify for next Saturday's state meet in Wisconsin Rapids, while the Rockets and Indians advance as teams.

"We took the grouping and Meghan really stepped forward today," said Fedenko. "We're going to need it again next week."

Neenah has plenty of experience at state, with second-place finishes the last two years.

"We'll be ready for it," said Patterson. "This'll be my fourth time there. We're used to it, we're just going to have a normal week."

"We're going to do pretty much what we've been doing all along," said Fedenko. "We're going to try to stay sharp but yet not tire them out. We were second last year and we were second the year before so we'd like to go back there and move up one notch."

In the boys' race, Appleton East finished third despite getting a first place from Abe Mendoza and a fifth from Aaron Sass.

"I was kind of surprised, there

was a lot of good competition out here," said Mendoza, who won with a time of 16:28.

"That's nice, but for them it's a little disappointing because they don't have the rest of the team (at state)," said Patriots coach Joe Perez.

East had a team score of 86, seven points behind runner-up Fond du Lac. Defending state champion West Bend West won the meet with 77 points.

"I can't complain, that's the way this sport works," said Perez. "Sometimes you win, sometimes you lose."

Ryan Patschke of Appleton West qualified individually by taking a fourth place.

"Through the woods it was kind of tough, but after that it got better," said Patschke. "Pretty much the whole race I was in fourth."

This is the first trip to state for Patschke, a senior who has run cross country all four years.

# Rockets get boost they need

**■ Meghan Patterson's third place lifts Neenah to the WIAA sectional title**

MANITOWOC — Neenah girls' cross country coach Ron Fedenko wanted an added ingredient to put his team over the top, and Saturday he got it.

The Fox Valley Association champion Rockets have always had high-placing packs, but have lacked a consistent top five finisher.

That changed at the WIAA Division 1 sectional meet held at University of Wisconsin Center-Manitowoc County, as Neenah's Meghan Patterson took third in the girls' race in 15:31. The Rockets also placed five runners within the top 19 to win the sectional with a score of 58 points, 18 more than Oshkosh West.

"I wanted to be in the top six, that was my goal," said Patterson. "The beginning was hard, I was so far behind. Once I got past the first mile or so I felt stronger."

"Meghan had an outstanding race, excellent effort," said Fedenko. "We definitely wanted someone to step forward and today was her day."

Patterson finished behind FVA and defending sectional champion Kendra Frederick of Fond du Lac and Oshkosh West's Bridget Kessen, both of whom broke the course record of 15:05. The top six indi-

# Rocket runners seek state title

■ The Neenah girls finished second in 1992 and 1993

A fourth state championship will be the goal of the Neenah High School girls cross country team when it travels to Wisconsin Rapids Saturday.

The Rockets, who won 1981, 1982 and 1983 state crowns, qualified by winning last Saturday's WIAA Division 1 sectional at Manitowoc with 58 points, or 18 fewer than runner-up Oshkosh West.

Failing to qualify were the Neenah boys, who finished fourth; the Menasha boys, in 14th place; and the Menasha girls, who were 16th.

Neenah's Meghan Patterson took fourth place in the girls race, finishing 32 seconds behind champion Kenda Frederrick of Fond du Lac.

Other Neenah scorers were Sara Codner 11th, Tina Schraufnagel 12th, Christy McCutcheon 14th and Jenny Grandone 18th.

Neenah's other runners are Krista Erickson, Danelle Johnson and Kristi Morris.

Schraufnagel, the alternate, ran in place of Johnson, who had a hip injury.

The state meet will be run at the Ridges Golf Club course at Wisconsin Rapids, and the Neenah girls are slated to run at 1:55 p.m. Saturday.

"I think we have a shot at winning the championship, but it all depends on who has a good day," said Rocket coach Ron Fedenko.

# Neenah's pack falls back

## ■ The Rockets finish sixth in the Division 1 girls' competition

WISCONSIN RAPIDS — This is not a good sign, thought Meghan Patterson.

The Neenah senior had knocked five seconds and 10 positions off her 1993 finish by taking 27th place at the WIAA girls' state cross country meet at The Ridges Golf Course. She was hoping that her Rockets teammates, known for their pack running, would be following soon.

She didn't see anybody.

"It's not looking too good," said Patterson.

The Rockets, second in Division 1 the past two years, were hoping to move up one notch in this year's state meet but it was not to be.

"By the one mile marker, I knew it was over," said Neenah coach Ron Fedenko. "By looking at the times compared to the conference and sectional meet, we were out of position already."

The Rockets eventually finished sixth with 202 points. Mukwonago edged Racine Case 106-108 for the team title.

"There's a lot of mental in this race," Fedenko said. "You just don't know what's going to happen."

"The course is a hard course," said Missy Tritt of Oshkosh West, which placed fifth. "We pushed each other throughout the race."

Kristina Betzold of Eau Claire North won her second straight state title, finishing in 14:34.

In Division 2, Kimberly was trou-

bled by illness but still managed a sixth place overall.

Kim Griesbach, who won last week's sectional title, faded after the first half mile as she lost her breath due to a respiratory infection. She finished 16th.

"I wanted to be in the top six," she said. "They just got away from me. I needed to work on my mental race too. It was bad."

Papermakers coach Mike Fox said despite the problems, he was pleased with the team's performance.

"You're never satisfied unless you get first," Fox said. "There was no way anyone could catch Mount Horeb and Mayville today. We were 36 points out of third, which isn't all that bad."

Mount Horeb placed four runners in the top six, including champion Rachael Anderson, to win the state title with 49 points. Mayville was second with 60.

Weyauwega-Fremont placed 12th with 258 points. The Indians were led by Andrea Yach's 57th place finish.

Freedom's Cathy Kempen, in her first state meet, placed 45th.

"I ran the best race I could," she said. "I'm pleased with my finish."

Winneconne's April Beard was 38th while teammate Susan Bandstra placed 43rd.

"It's a change from all the other meets all year," Bandstra said. "Usually you get to a meet and run right away. We got here at nine this morning so we've just kind of been lying around (the Division 2 race started at 1:20 p.m.). I think that

has a big effect ... You tended to think less about the race."

In the Division 3 meet, Gibraltar won the team title with 53 points, while Sevastopol's Maria Otto took the individual championship. The lone area competitor, Amanda Carrière of Amherst, placed 53rd.
