■ The Neenah cross country team wins five of the first six places

Claiming five of the first six places, the Neenah boys cross country team cruised to the championship of the Shawano Invitational Saturday.

The Rockets totaled 20 points, five short of a perfect score, and finished 33 points ahead of runner-up Green Bay Preble.

The championship was their fifth straight at Shawano and their second in as many weeks this season. They previously won at Rhinelander.

Manitowoc's Ken Gratz led the Shawano meet finishers in 16:27, coming home 21 seconds ahead of Neenah's Mike Heidke.

The parade of Neenah runners followed with Andy Marks placing third, Chris Core fourth, Paul Mason fifth and Ryan Waterstreet sixth.

The Rockets' Domenic Alexandroni was 13th and Mark Kerins 14th.

Menasha didn't qualify for team scoring because it only fielded four runners.

Neenah advances to 4-0 in the FVA with its 3-0 win

Neenah (4-0) took over the undisputed lead in Fox Valley Association soccer play by stopping previously unbeaten Appleton West 3-0 Thursday night.

For the second straight match, Kevin Beyer scored two goals for the Rockets. Chris Laux tallied the other.

Menasha (2-2) dropped FVA tests to Appleton East 4-1 and Fond du Lac 2-1 in overtime.

The losses were the first in two

blinking Wausau Newman 2-0 after losing to Oshkosh Lourdes 1-0.

Adam Goerlitz and Eric Headington scored against Newman as the Zephyrs upped their conference record to 2-1.

Lourdes kicked in its only goal on a rebound shot that bounced off the goal post.
