East, Kaukauna win harrier titles

KAUKAUNA — Team depth allowed one dynasty to continue while sidetracking another in the Fox Valley Association cross country championships Thursday at Countryside Golf Course.

Appleton East placed three runners in the top 10 and scored 44 points to easily outdistance Neenah (85), Menasha (86) and Kaukauna (88) for its third consecutive boys' title.

In the girls' meet, Kaukauna's balance allowed the Ghosts to snap a six-year run of FVA championships by Neenah, currently ranked ninth among the state's large schools. The Ghosts nipped the Rockets 63-64.

The Patriot boys' victory was led by Steve Jones with a third place, Mike Miller in fourth and Dan Karras sixth.

"Going in, we had hoped to have three runners in the top 10. And that's what happened," said Appleton East Coach Joe Perez.

"Our key is that we have seven good runners. Jones and Miller are usually near the front. But all season the other five have interchanged places. If one drops back another will pick up.

"So many funny things can happen in one of these meets, especially with the good quality you have in the league. If you're going to win you have to have the depth."

Menasha's Tom Severson (who finished third in last year's FVA meet) outkicked Neenah's Marty Netzel in the final 300 yards to win individual honors by one second.

"The season hadn't gone as well as I would have liked, but this makes up for it," said the Menasha senior. "I expected Steve (Jones) and Mike (Miller) to be there at the end, but I was surprised when I looked back and saw Marty. It was really scary because Marty has an excellent kick. But I kicked it in and held him off."

"I've had an on-and-off season," said Netzel, who played football for the Rockets last season. "I felt good today and was in good shape at the end. I had beaten him (Severson) earlier in the season with a kick, but I just couldn't get by him today."

The girls' competition also featured a two-way duel, with Oshkosh North's Beth Weiland taking an 8-second victory over Neenah's Jenny

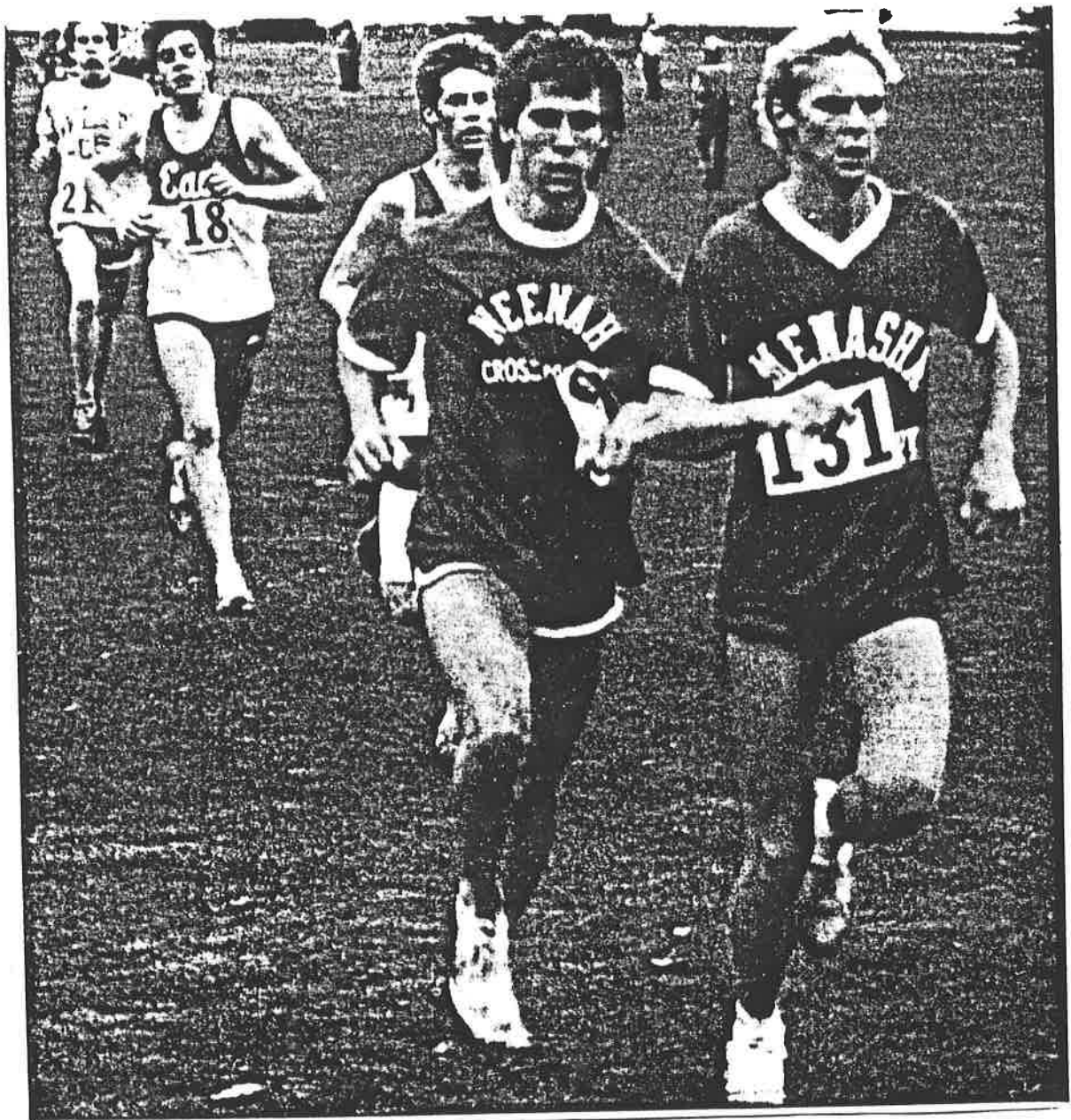

(Owens) had beaten me twice. I knew she was back there, so I just ran as hard as I could."

"I think I took off too fast at the start," Owens said. "I just wanted to be with her (Weiland) at the end. But she just had too much of a kick, and that was it."

Despite only having a top finish of sixth place (by Jenni Wenninger), Kaukauna won the team title on the strength of a 10th by Cindy Gertz, 13th by Carrie Dusenbery, 14th by Nancy Gritt and 20th by Lisa Doolittle. In addition to Owens, Neenah received a fifth from Amy Garlock and an eighth from Kayann Monard, but the Rockets' other runners finished well back in the pack.

"All season long we have run in a bunch, about 40 seconds apart," said Kaukauna Coach Gerald Brien. "Because only five places score, a lot of people forget about the other two runners. Our final two runners (Cathy

Hinkens in 26th and Jill Edwards in 30th) finished ahead of Neenah's fifth place, and that's one of the real keys right there.

"This is just a great win for us. Earlier, we had lost in a quadrangular to Neenah, and our girls really dedicated themselves to winning this," Brien said of the Ghost girls' first FVA harrier crown.

"It's tough to lose, especially by a single point, but we did quite well," said Neenah Coach Ron Fedenko. "Jenny ran very well, but she's small and the conditions hurt her. But Beth (Weiland) is a quality person. Jenny is only a sophomore and she'll be back."

In the boys' jayvees, John Paustian finished first, Art Fischer second and Scott Beyer third to pace Appleton East to an easy victory. Appleton West's Kristin Bubolz topped the girls' jayvee runners while Kaukauna took the team title.
