Rocket runners still unbeaten

■ **Neenah is ranked No. 1 in the state**

NEENAH — The Neenah High School boys cross country team, ranked No. 1 in the state last week, preserved its unbeaten record by winning Saturday's Shawano Invitational.

The Rockets, victorious in the West Bend Invitational and a conference minimeet in their first two outings, collected 31 points at Shawano to 62 for runner-up Appleton West.

Neenah's Ryan Freund led all runners through the chute with a winning effort of 16:47, 17 seconds better than Appleton West's Ryan Patschke.

Jeremy Ondresky was fifth, Don Alexandroni sixth, Rich Rasmussen ninth, Ben Miller 10th, Mike Heidke 13th, Chad Goretcke 14th and Jamie Remme 21st.

"I don't think we should be rated No. 1, but I think we belong in the top five," said Tom Jensen, who has begun his 27th season as coach of the Rockets.

"The kids worked hard during the summer. This is one of the closest teams I've had. They do a lot of things together."

Freund and Goretcke, both seniors, were named to the all-conference team last fall.

Other returning lettermen are Miller, a senior, and junior Andy Marks, currently sidelined with a knee injury.

Others seniors on the 29-man roster are Jamie Michalkiewicz, Remme, Rasmussen, Ryan Hayes and Ondresky, a transfer from Pennsylvania.

Juniors are Alexandroni, who is running cross country for the first time since the seventh grade, Mark Kerins, a transfer from Ohio, Chris Core, Matt Berg, Heidke and Joe Nichols.

Ryan Waterstreet, Brian Koslowski, Eric Smiltneek, Ryan Goretcke, Phil Rumpf and Matt Pazerdnik are the sophomore harriers.

Dan Vacek and Paul Olson are the only ninth-graders on the squad.

Glen Severson again is assisting Jensen.

GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY: The Neenah harriers, ranked second in the first state poll behind powerful Waukesha Memorial, were first in

the Shawano meet with 44 points.

Junior Christy McCutcheon, last year's most valuable performer, paced the Rockets with a sixth-place finish.

Kristi Morris was seventh, Danielle Johnson ninth, Sara Codner 10th and Meghan Patterson 12th.

Senior letterwinners on coach Ron Fedenko's 15th Neenah squad are Patterson, Krista Erickson and Missy Klabunde.

Junior returnees; in addition to McCutcheon, are Codner and Mandy Gunderson. Sophomore Heather Michalkiewicz also lettered last fall.

Non-lettering returnees are senior Lisa Heroux, juniors Holly Goudreau and Meghan Mutchler and sophomores Sarah Brey, Shayna Brown, Alicia Hilliker, Johnson, Norel Miller and Sara Mulroy.

Newcomers include senior Jenny Grandone, formerly of the tennis team; Gina Ondresky and Angela Kaphingst, sophomores; and Morris, Ann Vedder, Tina Schraufnagel, Brianna Schultz and Robyn Barnett, freshmen.
